

Report of Activities for the year 2019-2020

A district level mass awareness programme was organized for sensitizing stakeholders of higher educational institutions in Thrissur district, Kerala on responsible institutional waste management. The programme was organized by the Bhoomithrasena club, in collaboration with Enviro club and Biodiversity club, Christ College, Irinjalakuda and in technical collaboration with the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), Regional Directorate (South), Bengaluru with the objective to impart awareness to the teaching faculties, student coordinators of different clubs engaged in promoting green campus and on the scientific management of institutional wastes in the light of integrated waste management rules notified in 2016. The three-day training was organized with the financial support from KSCSTE, Govt. of Kerala, under their prestigious 'Environment Management Training' (EMT) programme for the year 2019-20. The target trainees were teaching faculties from various colleges in Thrissur district, student coordinators from various colleges, staffs from the health department of various local bodies in Thrissur district, staffs from Kerala State Pollution Control Board, district office, Thrissur and administrators from various colleges.

Apart from the training programme we also had taken initiatives for a plastic free Onam celebration 2019. Scientifically designed waste bins were installed at different locations in the campus for the category - wise segregation of solid waste. Awareness classes/ campaigns were conducted for the students/teachers to minimise the usage of plastics in the campus and the support from the management, students and teachers were really encouraging.

Christ College is part of a century old tradition of CMI education that is at its heart, Christian and specifically Catholic. Department of Geology and Environmental Science

Dept. of Geology was established in 1981. Geology is concerned with the application of Physical Sciences, Biological Science and Mathematics to understand the different processes of earth. A Postgraduate Degree in Environmental Science started in the year 1999 under the leadership of Geology Department. Christ College is the only college under Calicut University to offer Postgraduate Degree programme in Environmental Science in aided stream and the course is limited to 12 students. All the members of the faculty are actively involved in research oriented activities.

Department of Botany

Department of Botany established in June 1956 and the degree course in Zoology was started in 1957 with Botany as a subsidiary paper and it continued to initiate students into the wonderful world of flora. From 2013 onwards, Botany department offers M.Sc. in Botany (self-financing)

CHRIST COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) IRINJALAKUDA 'Clean Campus' - National Training Programme on sensitizing stakeholders for Responsible Institutional Waste Management (6th January - 9th January)



A Three-day national training programme on “Sensitizing Stakeholders for Responsible Institutional Waste Management” was held between 6th January -9 th January 2020 at Christ college (autonomous) Irinjalakuda. The programme was organised by Bhoomithrasena clubs in the college in association with Department of Environmental Science and with the financial aid from Kerala State Council for Science and Technology and Environment (KSCSTE), in technical collaboration with Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB). The programme commenced with the inaugural session where Dr Manju NJ, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Geology & Environmental Science, Programme Co-ordinator & Coordinator, Bhoomithrasena Club delivered the welcome note. The function was presided over by Dr. Mathew Paul Ukken, Principal, Christ College (Autonomous), Irinjalakuda. The formal inauguration was done by chief guest of honour, Dr. M. Madhusudanan, Regional Director Chennai, Scientist Central Pollution Control Board by lighting the traditional lamp. In the brief inaugural address of Dr Madhusudanan, he highlighted how increase in population and changes in lifestyle contributes to the waste generation and stressed the need of proper scientific waste management in institutions. He briefly added the statistics of waste generation in our country and was quite eye opening one. He congratulated the whole team for conducting the programme on such an



emergent topic. Er. Suseela Nair V. A. Environmental Engineer, Kerala State Pollution Control Board, Rev. Fr. Joy P.T. CMI Vice Principal & Assistant Professor, Dept. of BPE gave felicitation and the inaugural programme ended with the vote of thanks by Dr. Rekha V. B. Assistant Professor, Dept. of Geology & Environmental Science & Co-ordinator, Enviro club.

The inaugural sessions were followed by technical sessions chaired by Dr. Deepesh V, Scientist B, Central Pollution Control Board, Smt. Poornima B.M, Scientist C, CPCB, Bangalore. Smt Poornima delivered her talk on Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016. The speaker focused on solid waste management status of Kerala and strategies we are following in waste management etc. The afternoon session was started with the talk by Dr. Deepesh V on Hazardous Waste Management Rules,2016. In his exemplary and vibrant way of presentation he gave a detailed account on hazardous waste and waste management practices. These speeches were followed by question, discussion and viewpoints of the participants and speakers. The second day of the programme opened with the lecture by Smt Poornima, onE-waste management rules 2016, Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) and status of e waste management. She highlighted the Take Back policy, taking back their products from end users at the end of the products' useful life, and she also added how EPR in E-Waste Management Will Prove Beneficial for the Environment. Following the lecture Dr Deepesh went on to give an elaborate presentation on Biomedical Waste Management Rules, 2016 and Laboratory Waste Management. He delivered lecture on revised categories of biomedical wastes and its management strategies. He mentioned that there is a great need for rapid development



of many more CBMWTF to fulfil the need of treatment and disposal of all BMW generated in India. Following Dr Rekha V.B delivered talk on In house organic waste management and composting. She focused on different types of biogas plants that we can install for domestic waste management.

Post lunch sessions were handled by Mr Nithin K, Earth Sense Recycle pvt ltd Palakkad, and Dr Manju N.J. Mr Nithin talked about E waste recycling and collection strategies which received wide acceptance by the audience and positive response. Through a video lecture he showed how e wastes are being treated and recycled scientifically. Final session was dealt by Dr Manju on EMS in higher institutions and institutional waste management. Her focus was on sustainable campuses and what all can we done to make our campus sustainable in all levels. The programme concluded with the brainstorming session by Dr Bijoy C. Assistant Professor, Dept. Zoology & Co-ordinator, Biodiversity Club, where presenters and participants shared their ideas and remarks on sustainable campus and existing cleaning practices in the campuses, action plans to be implemented, etc. were discussed. The programme came to an end with the final day visit to IMAGE (Indian Medical Association Go Eco-friendly), India's highest efficient CBWTDF at Palakkad. A team of 32 members visited the plant was really worth full. Nearly 50 tonnes of hospital wastes are treated per day and the day to day operations of IMAGE is managed by a team of highly dedicated professionals. Reflections and feedback were received from each and every participant and distributed certificate. The participants had a great time of learning and were satisfied with the stimulating inputs from the expert educationists who had come from CPCB and other colleges. The programme was a grand success.
