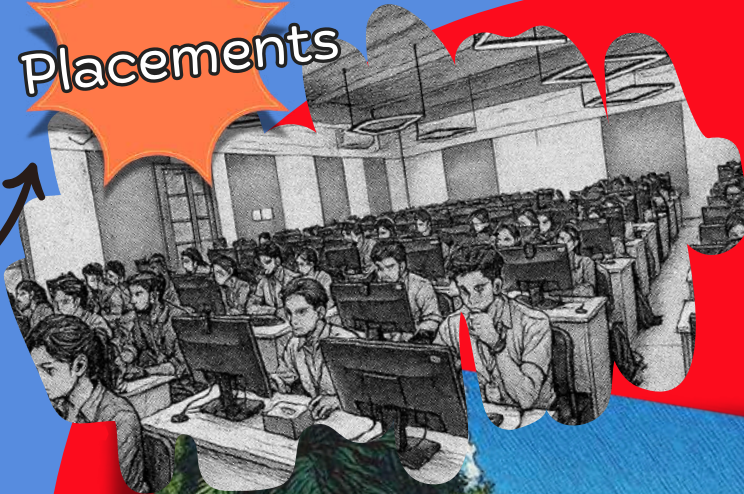

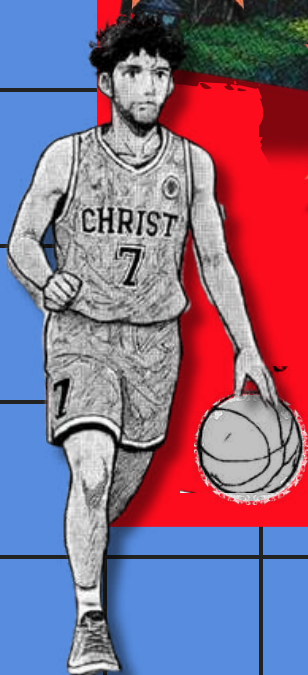

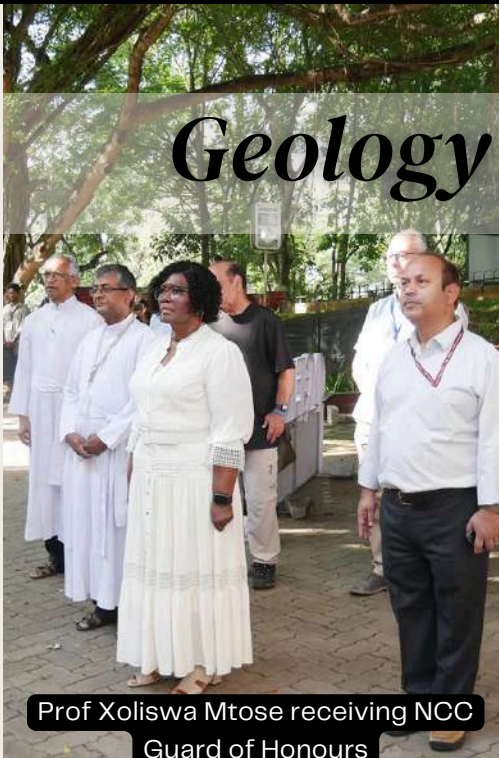
Geology & Environmental Science

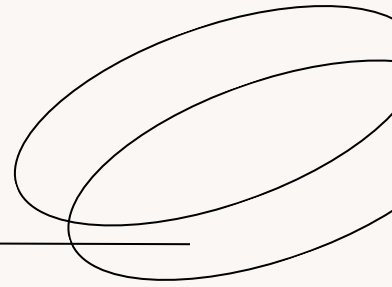
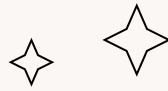

CATE LAB

The research team of CATE Lab (Centre for Animal Taxonomy and Ecology) of the Dept of Zoology made three notable spider discoveries from India. The orb-weaving spider *Leucauge rubromaculata* Benjamin, 2024 (family Tetragnathidae) is newly reported from the country. A new species of trapdoor spider, *Conothele mussoorie* sp. nov., has been described from the Himalayan foothills, marking the genus's first record in northern India. And, *Dendrolycosa robusta* (Thorell, 1895) has been reported for the first time from India. His book *Keralathile Chilanthikal* won the best book award by Sahyadri Natural History Society.

SER LAB

Since November 2024, the Shadpada Entomology Research lab (SERL) of Zoology Department has published seven research papers, including significant faunal records. Key contributions include the first Indian record of the rare green lacewing *Glenochrysa zeylanica* and 15 new records to Kerala, comprising 2 cuckoo wasps (*Chrysis fuscipennis* and *Chrysis pubescens*), 1 leaf-cutter bee (*Megachile vera*), 9 sweat bees, and 3 picture-wing antlions (*Indopalpares pardus*, *Palpares contrarius*, and *Stenares harpyia*). These findings mark important additions to India's and Kerala's insect biodiversity.

The Aqua Research Lab of Dept. of Geology & Environmental Science made two discoveries. Two new dragonfly species have been discovered from the Western Ghats: *Merogomphus aryanadensis* sp. nov. from Kerala and *M. flavoreductus* sp. nov. from Maharashtra. Another research paper is about the final instar larva and exuvia of *Aethriamanta brevipennis* (Rambur, 1842), described from Thumboor Wetlands, Kerala.

Lymantria kanara, a rare moth species belonging to the subfamily Lymantriinae of the family Erebidae, was first discovered in 1951 and is known to occur only in southern India. After a gap of 73 years, this elusive moth has been recorded for the first time from Kerala, specifically from the Siruvani forest region in Palakkad district, by researchers of Entomo Taxonomy Lab of Zoology Department.

Dr. Alappatt presented his research on MIS 3 Sea Level Changes from the coasts of South India at the 37th International Geological Congress (IGC) held in Busan, South Korea, in 2024. His participation was supported by the B.P. Radhakrishna Golden Jubilee Grant from the Geological Society of India and a Consultancy Grant from the Research Center of Earth and Environmental Sciences, Korea Basic Science Institute. Dr. Alappatt also participated in the training workshop of Growth of Leadership in the Earth Science Education (GLESE) Program, 2025 organized by International Geoscience Education Organization in Portugal.

Dr. Vargheese has made significant contributions to the fields of Language Teaching and Education through numerous publications indexed in Scopus and the Web of Science. His research encompasses a diverse range of areas, including post-apocalyptic narratives, AI-driven approaches and multiple intelligences in collaborative learning, the integration of AI in ESP curriculum design, the role of English in healthcare communication, and assessment practices in English for Specific Purposes.

Dr. Arun S.'s latest paper in Results in Chemistry introduces an eco-friendly method for synthesizing quinoline-triazole peptidomimetics. These novel compounds, created using multicomponent and Click Chemistry, showed promising inhibitory activity against CDK2—an enzyme linked to breast cancer progression.



Dr. Suresh K Govind

Dept. of Psychology

Dr. Suresh did a study which presents a critical and insightful examination of the increasing human-elephant conflict in Central Kerala, focusing on crop foraging behavior of wild Asian elephants (*Elephas maximus*) in the Thrissur district between 2009 and 2013. The research highlights a clear ecological and socio-economic pattern behind the conflict. The findings are published as "Patterns of Crop Foraging by Asian Elephants (*Elephas maximus*) in Central Kerala, India" in Springer in March.



Dr. Seena Varghese

Dept. of Mathematics

Dr. Seena's study delves into an advanced area of graph theory, focusing on a unique type of labeling called geodesic Leech labeling. The researcher investigated how numbers can be assigned to the edges of a graph so that the total weights of all shortest paths form a continuous sequence without gaps. The author demonstrated that infinite families of such graphs exist, while also proving that a simple 5-cycle (C_5) does not meet the criteria. The work not only expands theoretical understanding in the field but also opens up several new avenues for future research.

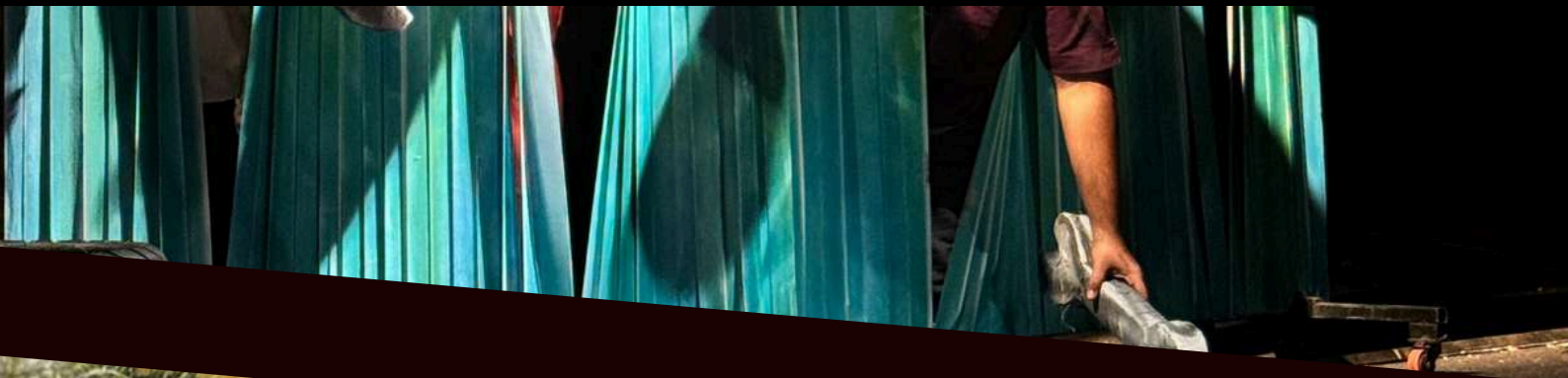

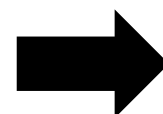

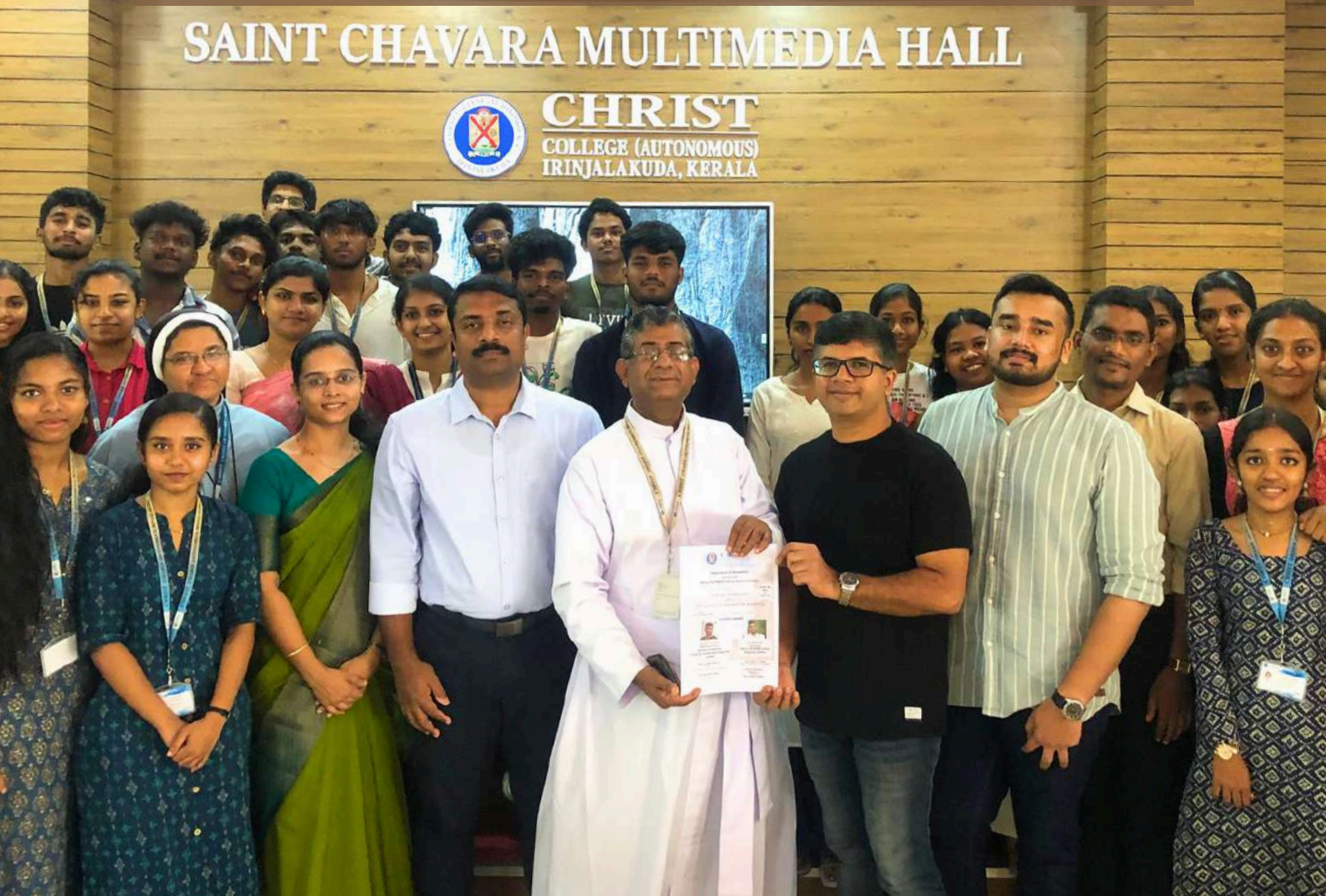
A Resource Sharing Programme was held by the department in Marymatha Arts and Science College, Mananthavady. An international internship preparation programme was done in April.
