




Christ College proudly secured the Kerala State Biodiversity Conservation Award 2025 for its exemplary commitment to protecting nature, promoting sustainability, and integrating eco-friendly practices into institutional functioning.

KERALA STATE AGRICULTURE AWARD



Christ College, Irinjalakuda, has been honoured with the Kerala State Agriculture Award instituted by the Department of Agriculture, Government of Kerala. The college received the award in the institutional category for its outstanding efforts in promoting agriculture and agricultural awareness through the Christ Agro Farm, which follows scientific, eco-friendly, and sustainable farming practices. Spread across five acres, the farm includes vegetable cultivation, fish farming, mushroom cultivation, a medicinal garden, sugarcane, turmeric, ginger, fruit trees, livestock units, and an innovation centre supporting agricultural research. It also offers free training in farming and animal care to the public and runs the "Krishipadam" programme for school students.

Christ College (Autonomous), Irinjalakuda continues to promote an eco-conscious campus through the “Grow with Nature” initiative, which encourages sustainability, environmental awareness, and student participation in eco-friendly practices. Key activities include Nest to Nature, Ornamental Fish Breeding (Aqua), Local Breed Horse Rearing, Conservation of Medicinal Plants (Nature’s Bounty Programme), and the new Agro Farm at the Snehabhavan Block, strengthening the college’s commitment to nature-focused learning and sustainability.



BIODIVERSITY CLUB



The Biodiversity Club of Christ College (Autonomous), Irinjalakuda carried out several environment-focused activities in 2025. In February 2025, the club observed World Wetland Day by organizing an intercollegiate PowerPoint presentation competition on the theme “Protecting Wetlands for Our Common Future.” This was followed by an invasive plant removal drive on the 7th, 10th, and 17th of February. A biodiversity documentation contest, Bioblitz-25, was also held on 12 February with participation from multiple departments. In June 2025, for World Environment Day, the club conducted an invited talk on “Diversity and Conservation of Sacred Groves” by Dr. Praveen Kumar, who explained their importance and the threats they face. 

The Research Collective

Researchers from the Centre for Animal Taxonomy and Ecology (CATE), Christ College, Irinjalakuda, have identified five new species from the Siruvani forests in the Western Ghats, near the Siruvani Dam in Palakkad district. The discoveries include a spider, millipede, earthworm, ant, and termite, highlighting the region's rich and understudied biodiversity.


Among the notable findings is *Leptopholcus siruvaniensis*, a rare long-legged spider and only the second species of its genus recorded in India, and *Polydrepanum spinatum*, a millipede species discovered after a gap of 40 years within its genus.

The team also reported a new termite species (*Speculitermes*) of significant scientific interest, a new ant species (*Dolichoderus rubragaster*), and a new earthworm species (*Drawida*), bringing the total *Drawida* species in Kerala to 31.


The study was led by Dr. Sudhikumar A.V., Head of CATE, with the participation of research scholars Anju K. Baby, Sibi K.K., Muhsina O.M., Jyothi U.M., Reshma R., Aishwarya P. Muralidharan, and Ardra R. Menon. The research was funded by CSIR and UGC and published in reputed international journals including *Zootaxa*, *Arachnology*, *Taprobanica*, and *National Academy Science Letters*.



The Research Collective

SER Lab (Dept of Zoology)

The Shadpada Entomology Research Lab (SERL) published seven research papers, including the discovery of three new Neuropteran species (two antlions and one owlfly) from the Western Ghats and the first-ever record of nine sweat bee species (Nomiinae) from Kerala. Documented from the Western Ghats, these findings significantly expand India's faunal inventory. In July 2025, Dr. Bijoy C and Dr. Suryanarayanan T. B. represented India at the 15th International Symposium of Neuropterology in Beijing, where they were the only Indian researchers invited, bringing international recognition to Kerala's entomological research.



Entomo Taxonomy Lab (Dept of Zoology)

The genus *Antitrisuloides* (family Noctuidae) has been reported for the first time from the Western Ghats of India.

Additionally, the subspecies *Antitrisuloides catocalina cyclica* has been recorded for the first time in India, based on specimens collected from Palakkad district, Kerala.

The discovery was made by Dr. Abhilash Peter and research scholar Ms. Joslin Treesa Jacob of the Entomo Taxonomy Lab, Department of Zoology, and published in the July 2025 issue of *Ecology, Environment and Conservation*.

Dr. Linto Alappatt received a grant from Chang'an University, Xi'an, China, to attend and chair a session at the International Conference on Water Security and Sustainable Development (ICWSSD 2025) held from 23–25 May 2025. He also presented a paper and chaired a session on Quaternary Geology and Geomorphology at the 3rd International Conference on Earth and Environmental Sciences 2025, conducted at the Durban International Convention Centre, South Africa, in collaboration with the University of Zululand. Dr. Alappatt has been appointed Academic Visitor at the School of Geography and the Environment, University of Oxford, for October 2025–November 2027, and served as Visiting Research Fellow at the Department of Environment, Sustainability and Planning, Bar-Ilan University, Israel, from 15–28 November 2022.

Dr. Jolly Andrews co-authored a notable research article in *Physica C: Superconductivity and Its Applications* (2025) titled "Spectral Domain Modeling of Superconducting Slotline in the Presence of an Oblique Applied Static Magnetic Field."



Dr. Sudheer Sebastian K authored two notable international publications in 2025. His study in *Physica Scripta* (IOP Publishing) used advanced simulations to enhance the efficiency of FASnI_3 -based inverted perovskite solar cells through optimized transport layers. His second work, published in the *Vietnam Journal of Science and Technology*, demonstrated improved performance of polymer solar cells using a simplified, ETL-free device architecture.



Dr. Swamynathan Sanjaykumar's recent work includes "Effects of Sectional Breathing Techniques on Women Athletes", "Power Yoga as a Recovery Tool for Women Volleyball Players", and "Fan Engagement in Cricket Matches", all in the *SRM Journal of Science and Humanities*.



Dr. Ajith Ramachandran co-authored the internationally acclaimed paper "Quantum Transport Enabled by Non-Adiabatic Transitions" published in *EPL (Europhysics Letters)*, 2025, offering key insights into advanced quantum transport and non-adiabatic transition phenomena.



Dr. Lipinraj K published three major international research papers in 2024 in reputed Scopus and Web of Science indexed journals. His studies in *Migration Letters*, *Naturalista Campano*, and the *Journal of Advanced Zoology* explore the role of artificial intelligence in banking, its impact on employee stress, and how job-related stress influences employee performance, offering valuable insights into technology and workforce dynamics in the banking sector.



Dr. Anees Rehman A and Dr. Nivedhya C.A. co-authored a study on landslide-induced agricultural losses in Idukki. Using an Agriculture Loss Index (ALI), the research identifies household vulnerability levels and highlights that 10% face severe impacts, providing data-driven insights for SDG-aligned resilience and policy interventions.



Dr. Jince Mon Cyriac, with collaborators, published two major international research papers in 2025. His work in the *Journal of Solid State Electrochemistry* introduced an innovative rGO-TiO₂ approach to enhance DSSC efficiency, while his publication in *Advanced Natural Sciences: Nanoscience and Nanotechnology* explored TiO₂-Cu multilayer thin films for advanced energy applications, marking valuable contributions to nanoscience and renewable energy research.




