# **Key Events and Activities:**

### 1. Victory Day Celebration (October 17, 2024):

The Union celebrated the victory of the election with a Band Melam,


RagadeepamMundathikod from 11 AM to 12:45 PM.





#### 2. <u>Union Inauguration Ceremony (December 4, 2024):</u>

The ceremony began with a welcome speech by Vice Principal Dr. Xavier Joseph and a presidential address by Rev. Fr. Dr. Jolly Andrews CMI. The program was inaugurated by Indian Dancer C Film Actor R.L.V. Ramakrishnan. The oath was taken by the College Union members, followed by speeches from Mr. Ishaq V I (Chairman), Dr. Xavier Joseph, Dr. Anilkumar N (Staff Advisor), and Ms. Pallikatil Mary Pathrose (Vice-Principal). The ceremony concluded with musical performances by Radio Legs (Musical Band), Vaishak (Singer), and Imbachi (Rapper).





#### 3. Second Union Parliament Meeting (December G, 2024):

Held at St. Chavara Seminar Hall, the meeting included speeches from Dr. Anilkumar (Welcome Speech) and Rev. Fr. Dr. Jolly Andrews CMI (Presidential Address). Mr. Louie Ben was elected as the Speaker of the Union Parliament, and Ms. Nayla was elected as Deputy Speaker. Ms. Fida was appointed as the Register of the Union Executive, and Mr. Adityan as the Sub-register. A decision was made to collect Rs. 600 as the Union Fund from the students.





#### 4. Gala De Christ (December 16-17, 2024):

The Union organized the first-ever Film Fest and Food Fest in Christ College Irinjalakuda. The Food Fest was inaugurated by Deepak Alukkal, a popular food vlogger. The event included e-sports, a movie recreation reel competition, and various food and film-related activities. The English Literature Department (Dil Se Delhi) won the first prize in the Food Fest, the runners up was obtained by Food Technology(Food Ashram), and 2nd runners up B.com Taxation (kashmir-Shikara)





## 5. Christmas Celebration and Retro Day (December 20, 2024):

The Christmas celebration was held in front of the college auditorium with Band Melam performances from New Friends Iringavoor and Students wore retro-themed attire, featuring styles from past decades, for the event.





#### 6. Chilambu 2025 (January 3-6, 2025):

Chilambu 2025 was a vibrant cultural event with various departments showcasing artistic and cultural performances, including a 'Kalolsava Vilambara Jadha' and a robot elephant, which amazed the audience. The event began with a speech by Union Chairperson Mr. Ishaq V I and was presided over by Rev. Fr. Dr. Jolly Andrews CMI. The event was inaugurated by Manager Mr. Joy Peenikmparambil, with felicitation from Dr. Anilkumar (Dean of Student C Staff Affairs), Ms. Vineetha (Fine Arts Coordinator), and Ms. Varsha (Fine Arts Member). The event concluded with a vote of thanks by Fine Arts Secretary Mr. Abishek Sathyan C.

With seven days of off-stage competitions and three days of on-stage competitions, Chilamb was a festival of art beyond being a competition between departments, where art and politics were discussed in eight venues from Dec 13 to 18 C Jan 3,4,6, 84 events were conducted. 8 stages were there for the on-stage competitions. The Valedictory Function held on January 6, 2025, was inaugurated by Mr. Shajar, Chairman of the Kerala State Youth Commission. ### 10. Basketball Tournament (Girls) - February 4, 2025:


The competition saw 9 teams participating, with BPE securing first place, Food Technology as runners-up, and Functional English in third place.
